The Complexities of State Authorization Communication

- Complex topic that requires a significant amount of details.
- Gut reaction is typically not positive.
- Regardless of endless communication efforts, your peers still have not heard of it!

Relationship Building

- Be intentional with your relationship building on campus.
- Schedule check-in meetings with stakeholders on a consistent basis.
- Work with institutional leadership to spread the word.

Policy Development

- Process began in May 2015.
- Faculty and staff were asking for a tool that defined roles and responsibilities.
- Formed a writing group of faculty and staff to help develop the first draft in November.
- Received approval in May 2016 to continue developing the policy.



Policy Development

- May June: Collected thoughtful feedback from faculty and staff.
- Hosted webinars, educational sessions, and 1:1 consultations.
- Presented to several leadership committees for approval.
- Policy name change.
- Target implementation date of December 1, 2016.

Goal of the Out-of-State Educational Activities Policy

- Define the roles and responsibilities of colleges and units conducting for-credit activities and business outside of Ohio.
- Ensure accurate reporting to NC-SARA each May, maintaining our membership.
- Increase awareness where Ohio State students are located.

State Authorization Advisory Committee (SAAC)

- Comprised of deans, faculty, staff, and students.
- Meets monthly or as needed.
- Reviews out-of-state activities and prioritizes non-SARA state applications.
- Assists communicating state authorization requirements to the university.

State Authorization Liaisons

- Serves as the unit point of contact.
- Submits trigger activity for SAAC on a monthly basis, and reports unit NC-SARA data to the State Authorization Team (SAT).
- Works with SAAC and SAT to develop unit-specific action plans, and communicate to unit stakeholders about state authorization regulations.

Develop a Communication Plan

- Work with marketing and communications to develop a strategy for state authorization.
- Brain-storm engagement opportunities.
- Be consistent and intentional.

Great news! Kentucky and Pennsylvania were approved as SARA member states as of October 31, 2016. This brings the total SARA member states and districts to 45. SARA approval means that The Ohio State University can provide out-of-state educational activities to students located in Kentucky and Pennsylvania. Educational activities include online courses and programs, on-ground experiences, and advertising and recruiting activities.

It is important to note that additional approvals may be required if more than 10 students per program are placed at an on-ground site. Additional licensing board approvals also may be required for programs that lead to professional licensure.







State Contact Information

Pursuant to the U.S. Department of Education's Federal Integrity Rules, The Ohio State University must provide to its out-of-state distance education learning students or prospective students the contact information for filing complaints with each state licensing entity and any other relevant agency that would handle the complaint.


If a student located in a SARA state has a complaint about an institution operating under SARA, complaints must first go through the institution's standard procedure for resolution of student grievances. If a student is not satisfied with the outcome of the institutional process, the complaint may then be brought to the SARA portal agency in the institution's home state. The state where the student is located also may resolve the complaint. Although students may choose to work through their own state's SARA office for complaint resolution, the SARA office of the state where the provider is located is responsible for staffing the investigation and complaint resolution.

STATE AUTHORIZATION RECIPROCITY AGREEMENT (SARA)

The State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement (SARA) is a national initiative to provide more access to online courses while maintaining compliance standards with state regulatory agencies. SARA allows institutions to provide online courses outside of their own state borders by seeking and maintaining state approvals via a streamlined process. To learn more about SARA, please visit: nc-sara.org @.

On March 2, 2015, the Midwestern Higher Education Compact (MHEC) approved the State of Ohio to Join SARA. On September 22, 2015, the National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (NC-SARA) approved institutional participation for The Ohio State University. The State of Ohio approved Ohio State University to participate in NC-SARA on September 11, 2015. NC-SARA is a voluntary, regional approach to state oversight of postsecondary distance education.

Current authorized SARA member states include: Alabama, Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado, District of Columbia, Georgia, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Mainie, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Missisippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Mexico, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia, and Wyoming.

Professional Licensure

Important Note for Students: If you are considering an online academic program that leads to a professional license, it is highly recommended you contact the appropriate licensing agency where you plan to receive instruction before beginning your academic program. SARA does not provide reciprocity for state professional licensing requirements. Academic programs and individual graduates must meet standards set by that state's licensure requirements in order for a graduate to be eligible for a license.

State authorization allows The Ohio State University to legally offer educational activities, and participate in recruiting and advertising activities outside Ohio. Authorization requirements vary by state and program and can impact university operations. At Ohio State, we have a team dedicated to researching regulations, seeking and maintaining approvals, and communicating changes in approval status.

SARA

The State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement (SARA) is a national initiative to provide more access to online courses while maintaining compliance standards with state regulatory agencies. Participating institutions can offer educational opportunities in all SARA member states without seeking separate approvals in each state.

Ohio State was approved as an institutional SARA participant in 2015. Participation in SARA expands educational opportunities for students nationwide, decreases university risk, and saves money on offering our programs nationally.

SARA establishes nationwide standards for interstate offerings of education, but additional approvals are required for programs that lead to professional licensure or programs placing more than 10 students per site in a participating state.



International Enrollments

The Ohio State University works to provide global access to its online degree programs. While we carefully track issues related to international authorization and licensure, it is the student's responsibility to understand current circumstances or special requirements surrounding whether the online degree selected will be recognized in the student's country of residence and/or any country in which the student intends to work; how the collection of student data may be used in any such country; and whether the student will be subject to additional withholding taxes in addition to the price of tuition. Several countries will not formally recognize foreign online degrees, which may have implications for students who later seek to enroll in other educational programs, or for those who seek employment with such a country's government or other employers requiring specific credentials. International students considering an academic program that leads to a professional license should first confirm with the appropriate professional licensing board in their country of residence or country in which they intend to work as to whether an Ohio State degree is recognized when seeking licensure or certification.
